Okazaki was inclusive and was one of the first to teach non-orientals traditional eastern martial arts. As outlined in his Esoteric Principles, he believed honesty was the foundation of all virtue and that "service to humanity is the fountain of mutual existence and common prosperity."

During the early 1950's, the AJI accepted Koshoryu Kenpo into its ranks and thus the Karate Division was born. Since then our members have included practitioners of Jujitsu, Judo, Karate, Kenpo, Aikido, Kajukenbo and Escrima.

The AJI is was formed in 1939 by Professor Henry Seishiro Okazaki, creator of the Kodenkan - Danzan Ryu system of Jujitsu. The organization was initially known as the America Jujitsu Guild.

Okazaki studied various arts including Namba-Shoshin Ryu, Tenshin-Shinyo Ryu, Yoshin Ryu, Kodokan Judo, Iwaga Ryu, Kosogabe Ryu, Ryukyu Karate Jutsu etc. He studied Okugi, considered to be very secret techniques.

Okazaki eventually formed an eclectic system of jujitsu which is known today as Kodenkan, or Danzan Ryu Jujitsu.

Okazaki also studied Health Sciences and Physical Therapy. In 1929 opened the Nikko Sanatorium Of Restoration Massage. Thus the Okazaki Seifukujutsu Institute was established. Student's of his were also expected to excel in the Okazaki system of restorative massage.

Today, the AJI is recognized as the senior jujitsu organization in the country. Indeed, two charter members remain today. Professors Wally Jay (Life Member) and Jack Wheat (Vice President) are two original members who are listed as Directors at the signing of the original charter in 1947

The enormous interest in Kodenkan Jujitsu today, along with the growing number of organizations attributing their roots to him, is testament to the legacy of Professor Okazaki.
